

Want to study Greek at a tertiary level but your university doesn't offer it? You can now enrol in a Greek unit at La Trobe and have the credit count towards your degree at your current university!

It may seem like a big process, but we have broken it down into simple steps you can take to enrol in Greek at La Trobe as a cross-institutional subject at your university.

**TIP:** Most universities require approval from the faculty of your course! When seeking this approval it is best if you provide them with as much detail as possible about why you want to enrol in a Greek unit at La Trobe. Ensure you provide the unit number and name as well.

## Study Greek at La Trobe as an ACU student

- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek: beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the syllabus/subject outline by searching for your subject in the La Trobe University handbook and saving it as a PDF
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty at ACU to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the units will count towards your degree.
- Submit the ACU application for <u>Cross-Institutional Enrolment</u>. Attach the Greek unit subject outline, written approval from Stephie and your faculty.
  - Contact <u>AskACU</u> if you need any assistance when filling out the form or submitting it
- Once you receive approval from ACU to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to ASK <u>La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe University student number, email address, and access to the Greek unit module.
- Contact <u>AskACU</u> to provide evidence of your active enrolment at La Trobe and they will manually add the subject to your study plan.
- You are now ready to study Greek at La Trobe! Enjoy!



## Study Greek at La Trobe as a DEAKIN UNIVERSITY student

- Deakin University first year students are typically unable to enrol to complete a subject at another university.
  - Contact Deakin <u>Student Central</u> if you wish to discuss your situation and apply for an exemption
- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek: beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the subject outline by searching for your subject in the <u>La</u>
     <u>Trobe University handbook</u> and saving it as a PDF
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty at Deakin to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the Greek unit will count towards your degree.
- Contact <u>Deakin Student Central</u> for assistance in completing and submitting a Cross-institutional Enrolment Form. Attach the Greek unit subject outline and any other supporting documentation, including the written approval from Stephie and your Faculty to undertake the Greek unit.
- Once you receive approval from Deakin to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to <u>ASK La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe University student number, email address, and access to the Greek unit module.
- Contact <u>Deakin Student Central</u> to provide evidence of your active enrolment at La Trobe and they will manually add the subject to your study plan.
- You are now ready to study Greek at La Trobe! Enjoy!



## Study Greek at La Trobe as a UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE student

- Check your eligibility to apply to study a Greek unit at La Trobe:
  - Have maintained a strong academic record (normally 65% average)
  - Have completed one full-time semester of study at the University of Melbourne
  - Have a solid reason for enrolling in your chosen Greek unit
- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek: beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the subject outline by searching for your subject in the <u>La</u>
     <u>Trobe University handbook</u> and saving it as a PDF
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you
   have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the
   subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the Greek unit will be counted towards your degree.
- Complete and submit a <u>Cross-Institutional Enrolment application</u>. If any
  questions arise during this process, visit <u>here</u> for further information or contact
  <u>University of Melbourne's Stop1</u> student support service.
- Submit your supporting documents via an <u>online enquiry</u>. Label your enquiry as "[Student number] - Cross institutional outgoing application - Supporting documents".
- Once you receive approval from the University of Melbourne to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to <u>ASK La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe
  University student number, email address, and access to the Greek unit module.
- Contact <u>Stop1</u> to provide evidence of your active enrolment at La Trobe and they
  will manually add the subject to your study plan.
- You are now ready to study Greek at La Trobe! Enjoy!



### Study Greek at La Trobe as a MONASH UNIVERSITY student

- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek:
   beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the subject outline by searching for your subject in the <u>La</u>
     <u>Trobe University handbook</u> and saving it as a PDF
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you
   have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the
   subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the Greek unit will be counted towards your degree.
- Fill out a <u>Complementary Study application form</u>. Attach the Greek unit subject outline and any other supporting documentation, including the written approval from Stephie and your Faculty to undertake the Greek unit. Any questions during this process can be directed to <u>Monash Connect</u>.
  - If you are studying law, you will need to submit an additional complementary study form
- Submit the form to your faculty at Monash.
- Once you receive approval from Monash to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to <u>ASK La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe University student number, email address, and access to the Greek unit module.
- Contact Monash Connect with evidence of your active enrolment at La Trobe and they will manually add the subject to your study plan.
- You are now ready to study Greek at La Trobe! Enjoy!



### Study Greek at La Trobe as an RMIT UNIVERSITY student

- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek:
   beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the syllabus/subject outline by searching for your subject in the <u>La Trobe University handbook</u> and saving it as a PDF
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you
   have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the
   subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty at RMIT to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the units will count towards your degree.
- Complete the RMIT application for <u>Outbound Cross-Institutional Study</u>. Attach
  the Greek unit subject outline as well as any other additional supporting
  documentation. This can include written approval from Stephie and your faculty.
- Submit the Outbound Cross-Institutional Study application form via your <u>Student</u> <u>Connect Portal</u>.
  - Contact <u>RMIT Student Connect</u> if you need any assistance when filling out the form or submitting it
- Once you receive approval to enrol from RMIT in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to <u>ASK La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe
  University student number, email address, and access to the Greek unit module.
- Contact <u>RMIT Student Connect</u> to provide evidence of your active enrolment at La Trobe and they will manually add the subject to your study plan.

## Study Greek at La Trobe as a SWINBURNE UNIVERSITY student

- Decide which La Trobe Greek language unit best suits your level of Greek: beginner, intermediate or advanced.
  - Make a copy of the syllabus/subject outline by searching for your subject in the La Trobe University handbook and saving it as a PDF
- Create a course planner for the semester you will be enrolling in the Greek unit.
  This will include writing all the subjects you will undertake at Swinburne in
  addition to the La Trobe Greek unit so Swinburne can see how the Greek unit will
  fit into your studies.
- Receive written approval from Dr Stephie Nikoloudis
   (s.nikoloudis@latrobe.edu.au) saying you are able to take the Greek subject you
   have chosen. Also contact Stephie if you need any assistance determining the
   subject level to take.
- Receive written approval from your faculty at Swinburne to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the units will count towards your degree.
   Complete this <u>academic approval form</u>.
- Submit the Swinburne application for <u>Outbound Cross-Institutional Study</u>. Attach the Greek unit subject outline, your semester course planner, written approval from Stephie and the academic approval form.
  - Contact <u>Swinburne StudentHQ</u> if you need any assistance when filling out the form or submitting it
- Once you receive approval from Swinburne to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to ASK <u>La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe

- Receive written approval from your faculty at Victoria University to apply to enrol in Greek at La Trobe and to ensure the units will count towards your degree.
- Submit the Victoria University application for <u>Cross-Institutional Outbound Study</u>.
   Attach the Greek unit subject outline, written approval from Stephie and your faculty.
  - Contact <u>VUHQ</u> if you need any assistance when filling out the form or submitting it
- Once you receive approval from Victoria University to enrol in your chosen Greek subject, complete the <u>inbound cross-institutional study form</u> to enrol in your chosen Greek unit at La Trobe.
  - Call or email <u>La Trobe University</u> if you need guidance completing this form. The form will then be submitted to <u>ASK La Trobe</u>
- When accepted into the La Trobe Greek subject, you will receive a La Trobe

# Alternatively, you can also enrol in a <u>Diploma in Languages</u> at La Trobe University!

#### What is it?

A Diploma in Languages at La Trobe University is a full course, with a minimum three year duration, dedicated to learning Greek at a tertiary level. You'll learn all the basics (reading, writing, listening and speaking) in the Modern Greek language, or you'll improve on your existing skills in the area if you enrol in the intermediate or advanced course streams.

You'll also have the opportunity to study aspects of Greek culture, literature, history and politics from the ancient world to contemporary Greece and the diaspora across time and space.

#### **Culture Subjects**

Alongside <u>six</u> compulsory language subjects, you can take <u>two</u> of the following culture subjects! Please note that not all of these subjects are offered every year.

- Sem. 1: EST2WTH Women Through History in Europe and Latin America
- Sem. 2: EST3ECC Ethnic and Civil Conflict in Southern Europe and Cyprus
- Sem. 2: EST3TET Trans-European Translation
- Summer: HUS3ISB International Study Tour "Connecting with Language and Culture in Greece"

#### Where will it take me?

Modern Greek can prepare students for a range of careers, including translating and interpreting services, language teaching, tourism and hospitality, foreign affairs, international relations, law, banking, health and aged care, media, immigration and social work.

#### How to apply?

- Click on "Select a major" and choose the level of Greek you want to study
- Click on "Apply direct (non-Yr 12 students)"
- You will be taken to a page with two options: to either log-in to an existing La Trobe University account or start an application. Select "Start Application"
- Create your account and follow the prompts to fill out your application
