Section 2

Section 2 has two parts:

- Part A: Reading, listening and responding in **English**. (20 marks)
- Part B: Reading and responding in **Greek**. (15 marks)

(It is important to respond in the correct language.

If you respond in the wrong language, you will not achieve any marks.)

Part A:

Reading, listening and responding in English

There are two texts for Section 2 – Part A.

- The two texts will be related in subject matter and/or context.
- Students will be required to read one text in Greek. (Text 3A)
- Students will be required to listen one text in Greek. (Text 3B)
- Questions will be phrased in English for responses in **English**.

Part A:

Reading, listening and responding in English

Questions for Section 2 — Part A


- Questions may relate to either Text 3A or Text 3B, or to both texts.
- Students may be required to extract, summarise, interpret and/or evaluate information and/or compare aspects of both texts.
- Students may also be required to comment on the target audience, the purpose of the text and/or the way in which language is used in the text to achieve a purpose.

(Remember: Check the mark next to each Question. That will help you to identify how many points you will need to include in your answer.)

Part A: Reading, listening and responding in English

- Students will be given five minutes to read Text 3A as well as the Questions before the listening text (Text 3B) is played.
- The listening text (Text 3B) will be played twice.
- There will be a pause between the first and second playing.

- Students will produce a text in Greek in which they develop ideas, opinions and/or arguments based on evidence in the text.
- The task will specify a context, purpose, style of writing (personal, imaginative, persuasive, informative or evaluative), audience and text type.

Question for Section 2 — Part B


- There is only one question.

- The task will be phrased in English and Greek for a response in **Greek**.

Part B: Reading and responding in Greek


- The criteria for this section are:
 - 1. the capacity to understand general and specific aspects of texts
 - 2. the capacity to convey information and opinions accurately and appropriately.

(Remember: You will not be awarded separate marks for content and language accuracy.)

- 1. Read the Question in Greek and in English. Make sure you highlight:
 - 1. Text type
 - 2. Style of writing



2. Read the text and underline / highlight the information you can use in your response.



- 3. You will need to write approximately 150 words in your answer.

 (Remember: . Do not provide lengthy responses beyond the scope of the task and do not include additional information that is irrelevant.)
- 4. You will need to write the information in your own words.
